DIVORCE CHECKLIST FOR PRO SE LITIGANTS

(designed for parties who are representing themselves in a divorce lawsuit)
you are representing yourself, below is a checklist that you must complete before appearing in court force. Remember, neither the Grimes County District Clerk nor the Court Staff can give you legal you have legal questions you should contact a competent attorney to assist you.
 You <u>must</u> have filed all necessary paperwork (including a proposed Final Decree of Divorce) wit the Grimes County District Clerk's office <u>before</u> your case is placed on the Uncontested Docke for your final hearing. You must have the following:
Petition for Divorce (filed when you started your divorce) Waiver of Citation If you are using a Waiver of Citation, this document <u>must</u> have been signe by the Respondent in front of a notary public and notarized <u>on a date after</u> the Original Petitio for Divorce was filed, and filed with the District Clerk at least ten days <u>before</u> the final hearing.
Proof of Service of Citation for a default (if Respondent was served and did not file a Waiver). Texas Department of State Health Services – Vital Statistics Forms. Obtain these from the Grime County District Clerk's Office. Proposed Final Decree of Divorce
F CHILDREN ARE INCLUDED, YOUR DECREE MUST ALSO HAVE:
The forms or language for either a Standard Possession Order, or provisions for possession an access to the child(ren) by the other parent. If not Standard, be prepared to explain the difference The forms for child support, including the amount of money to be paid either weekly, bi-weekly monthly, or otherwise, and include provisions for insurance to be carried on the childre (Including private insurance, Medicaid, CHIPS, TriCare, etc.), and deductible payments.
he Final Decree of Divorce <u>must</u> include all of the elements necessary under Texas law. You have several options available to you to get this done: Contact a private attorney;
Contact a private attorney; Contact Lone Star Legal Aid at www.lonestarlegal.org , to see if you qualify for representation b their attorneys;
Find information and forms online at www.texaslawhelp.org (then click on Family Law an Domestic Violence, and then click on Divorce / Free Forms) or at www.freetexasforms.org (the click on either Divorce in Texas WITH Children or Divorce in Texas WITHOUT Children); or If you have been a victim of domestic abuse, contact the Texas Advocacy Project Assisted Pro S Program at (866) 598-4277, to see if you qualify for assistance by their attorneys.
 If you do not have an agreement with your spouse, and your spouse has filed an answer, your cas will not be heard on the Uncontested Docket and you will need to request a court date from the Court Coordinator.
 If there were children born during this marriage who are under the age of 18 years, the Courecommends that you either: a) attend a parenting class; b) explain to the Court why you cannot attend such a class; or c) enroll in www.OurFamilyWizard.com . Be prepared to tell the Court which you have done, or why you should not be required to do so.
 Pick up a form entitled <i>Information on Suit Affecting the Family Relationship</i> (Texas Department of State Health Services-Vital Statistics Form)(called BVS forms) from the Grimes Count District Clerk's office. Fill out the form according to the instructions and either file it with the Grimes County District Clerk, or bring the form with you to Court for the final divorce hearing.
Except for unusual circumstances, you will not be able to get a divorce if 60 days have not elapse

Only after you have completed all of the above should you check the Court website at www.court506.com for an available date on the Uncontested Docket for the final divorce hearing. Then, all you need to do is appear in the Grimes County District Clerk's Office 30-minutes before court and ask to have your file pulled for a final hearing.
